Straight knitting needles, size 6 $(4.00 \mathrm{~mm})$ OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
Spare straight knitting needle, size 6 ( 4.00 mm )
3 St markers - 2 regular st markers and 1 removeable st marker for center st

## gauge

22 sts $=4^{\prime \prime} ; 28$ rows $=4^{\prime \prime}$ in St st TO SAVE TIME, TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE

## STITCH GLOSSARY

CDD: SI 2 as if to k2 tog, k1, pass 2 slipped sts over.

## NOTE

This shawl is an unusual shape. The 2 wings are worked first, leaving live sts on needles. The center section is then worked, joining to the live sts (sts on needles) of alternating wings at the end of each row. The center section is only joined to half of each wing, leaving the other half free. These free sections form points that will fit over each shoulder as shawl is worn.

## FIRST WING

Cast on 4 sts. Purl 1 row.
Row 1 (RS): K2, yo, k2-5 sts.
Row 2 (WS): P2, k1, p2.
Row 3: K2, yo, k1, yo, k2-7 sts.
Row 4: P2, k3, p2.
Row 5: K2, yo, k3, yo, k2-9 sts.
Row 6: P2, k5, p2.
Row 7: K2, yo, k2 tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK, yo, k2 - 11 sts.
Row 8: P2, k2, p3, k2, p2.
Row 9: K4, yo, (k1, yo) 3 times, k4-15 sts.
Row 10: P2, k3, p5, k3, p2.
Row 11: K3, k2 tog, yo, k2, yo, k1, yo, k2, yo, SSK, k3-17 sts.
Row 12: P2, k3, p7, k3, p2.
Row 13: K5, yo, k3, yo, k1, yo, k3, yo, k5-21 sts.
Row 14: P2, k4, p9, k4, p2.
Row 15: K4, k2 tog, yo, k9, yo, SSK, k4.
Row 16: P2, k4, p9, k4, p2.
Row 17: K6, yo, k9, yo, k6-23 sts.
Row 18: P2, k5, p9, k5, p2.

Row 19: K5, k2 tog, yo, k3, CDD, k3, yo, SSK, k5-21 sts.
Row 20: P2, k5, p7, k5, p2.
Row 21: K7, yo, k2, CDD, k2, yo, k7.
Row 22: P2, k6, p5, k6, p2.
Row 23: K6, k2 tog, yo, k1, CDD, k1 yo, SSK, k6 - 19 sts.
Row 24: P2, k6, p3, k6, p2.
Row 25: K8, yo, CDD, yo, k8.
Row 26: P2, k7, p1, k7, p2.
Row 27: K7, k2 tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK, k7.
Row 28: P2, k6, p3, k6, p2.
Row 29: K8, yo, k3, yo, k8-21 sts.
Row 30: P2, k6, p5, k6, p2.
Row 31: K8, yo, k1, CDD, k1, yo, k8.
Row 32: P2, k6, p5, k6, p2.
Row 33: K8, yo, k5, yo, k8-23 sts.
Row 34: P2, k6, p7, k6, p2.
Row 35: K8, yo, k2, CDD, k2, yo, k8.
Row 36: P2, k6, p7, k6, p2.
Row 37: K8, yo, k7, yo, k8-25 sts.
Row 38: P2, k6, p9, k6, p2.


Row 39: K8, place marker, yo, k3, CDD, k3, yo, place marker, k8-25 sts.
Row 40: P2, k6, sl marker, p9, sl marker, k6, p2.
Row 41: K8, sl marker, yo, k3, yo, CDD, yo, k3, yo, sl marker, k8-27 sts.
Row 42: P2, k6, sl marker, p11, sl marker, k6, p2. Mark center st with removeable marker.
Row 43: K8, sl marker, yo, $k$ to 1 st before center st, CDD (moving removeable marker to st remaining after p2sso), $k$ to next marker, yo, sl marker, k8.
Row 44: $P 2$, $k 6, s l$ marker, $p$ to last marker, $s l$ marker, k6, p2.
Row 45: K8, sl marker, yo, $k$ to 1 st before center st, yo, CDD (moving removeable marker to st remaining after p2sso), yo, $k$ to last marker, yo, sl marker, k8-2 sts added.
Row 46: P 2 , k6, sl marker, p to last marker, sl marker, k6, p2. Rep Rows 43 - 46 until there are 91 sts on needle, working last row with spare needle and dropping all markers, end on WS. Break off yarn and leave sts on spare needle ready to work a RS row.

## SECOND WING

Work same as first wing, ending on RS instead of WS - 91 sts. DO NOT break off yarn.

## CENTER SECTION

With yarn still attached to the second wing, cast on 8 sts (by knit-on method). K the first st from firstwing needle, then pass the last cast-on st over it. Turn - 8 sts in center section.

SI 1, place marker, k6, place marker, p the last caston st tog with the next st of the second wing, turn - 8 sts in center section.

Row 1 (RS): SI 1, yo, sl marker, k6, sl marker, yo, work an SSK using the last st of center section and the next st from the first wing - 10 sts in center section. Turn.
Row 2 (WS): SI 1, p to first marker, sl marker, k6, sl marker, $p$ to last st, $p$ the last st of center section tog with the next st from the second wing.
Row 3 (RS): SI 1, k to first marker, sl marker, k6, sl marker, k to last st of center section, work an SSK using the last st of center section and the next st from the first wing. Turn.
Row 4 (WS): Repeat Row 2.
Row 5 (RS): SI 1, $k$ to first marker, yo, sl marker, k6, sl marker, yo, k to last st of center section, work an SSK using the last st of center section and the next st from the first wing - 2 sts added to center section. Turn.
Rep Rows 2-5 twenty times more, then work Row 2 once more, continuing across remaining sts on wing on final rep of Row 2. Knit 2 rows, working across one wing, center section, then the other wing. Bind off knitwise.


## ABBREVIATIONS \& TERMS

## Knit

beg: beginning
CC: contrasting color
cn: cable needle
cont: continue
dec: decrease
dpn: double pointed needles
est: established
inc: increase
K: knit
KSP: Knit 1, then slip stitch back to left hand needle, lift 2nd stitch on left hand needle back over returned stitch and replace returned stitch on RH needle (1 stitch decreased).
K2SP: Knit 2 together, then slip stitch back to left hand needle, lift second stitch on left hand needle back over returned stitch and replace returned stitch on right hand needle (2 stitches decreased).
LH: left hand
Ip(s): loop(s)
LT2 (Left Twist): Skip 1 stitch, knit second stitch through back loop, then knit both stitches together through back loop
MC: main color
M1 k: Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch (1 stitch increased).
M1p: Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch (1 stitch increased).
p: purl
pat(s): pattern(s)
pm: place marker
psso: pass slip stitch over knit stitch
p2sso: pass 2 slip stitches over knit stitch
rem: remaining
rep: repeat
RH: right hand
rnd(s): round(s)
RS: right side
RT2 (Right Twist): Knit 2 stitches together, leaving them on the left hand needle, then knit the first stitch again slipping both stitches to the right hand needle.
SKP: slip 1, knit 1, pass slip stitch over
sl: slip
SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.
st(s): stitch(es)

TBL: through back loop(s)
tog: together
WS: wrong side
wyib: with yarn in back
wyif: with yarn in front
yo: yarn over
end on WS: end having just completed a Wrong Side row.
end on RS: end having just completed a Right Side row
STOCKINETTE ST (St st): Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working on straight needles. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round on a circular needle. Reverse St st (Rev St st): Purl 1 row, knit 1 row alternately when working on straight needles. The purl side is the right side of the work. Purl EVERY round when working in the round on a circular needle.
GARTER ST: Knit EVERY row when working on straight needles. Knit 1 round, purl 1 round when working on a circular needle.

## Crochet

bphdc (back post half double crochet): Yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back around post of half double crochet one row below, yarn over, draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through all 3 loops on hook (this is worked on even \# or wrong side rows).
bptr (back post triple): Yarn over twice, insert hook from back to front around post of stitch on previous row and pull up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times.
ch: chain
dc: double crochet
fphdc (front post half double crochet): Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front around post of half double crochet one row below, yarn over, draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through all 3 loops on hook (this is worked on odd \# or right side rows)
fptr (front post triple): Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back around post of stitch on previous row and pull up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times.
hdc: half double crochet
hdctbl: Half double crochet worked in the back loop hdctfl: Half double crochet worked in the front loop
sl st: slip stitch
sp: space
tr: treble
